North Dakotans Support Smoke-Free Environments

A 2006 study conducted by Winkelman Consulting of Fargo revealed strong public support for prohibiting smoking in most public places. The study was based on a random-sample telephone survey of 1,728 North Dakotans 18 and older.

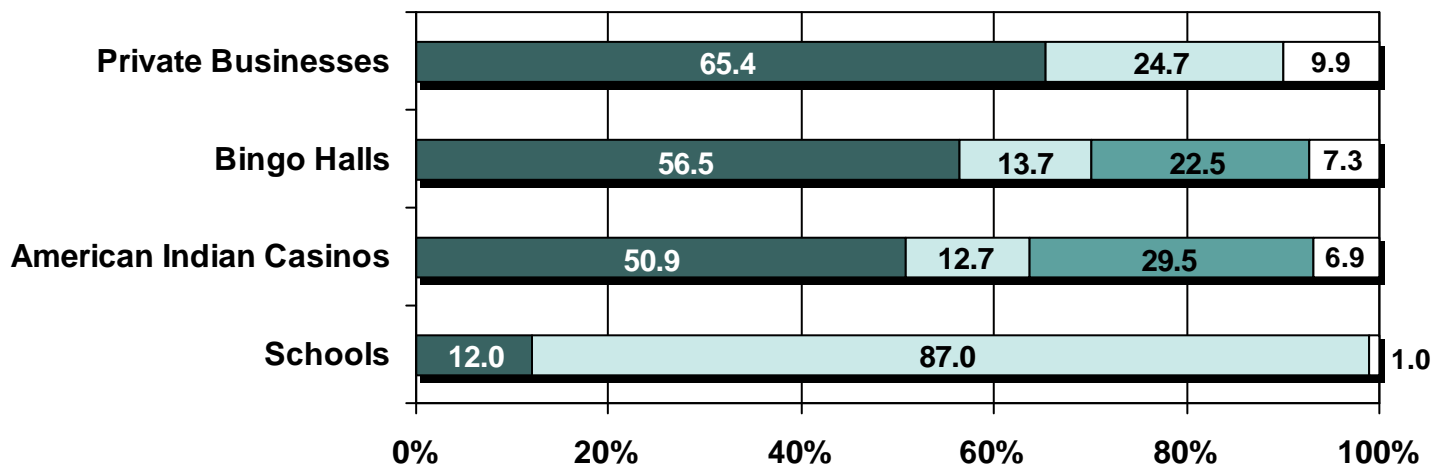
▶ More than 66 percent of North Dakota adults support expanding the state smoke-free law to prohibit smoking in all North Dakota workplaces, including bars and cocktail lounges.

▶ More than 90 percent of North Dakota adults believe smoking should not be allowed in private businesses and other nongovernmental work sites, and 24.7 percent of those would extend the ban to the grounds.

▶ More than 70 percent believe smoking should not be allowed in bingo halls, and 13.7 percent of those would extend the ban to the grounds.

▶ Nearly 64 percent believe smoking should not be allowed in American Indian casinos, and 12.7 percent of those would extend the ban to the grounds.

▶ Ninety-nine percent believe smoking should not be allowed in school buildings, and 87 percent of those would extend the ban to the grounds.
